2016: San Juan Baustia. The plastic tubs contain photocopied sheets of information gathered by Los Bexareños during the 1980s. There are legal and letter size pads with transcribed and non transcribed marriages, baptisms, and burials of both civilian and military settlers at San Juan Bautista del Rio Grande.

Several legal size photocopies of Spanish Colonial and Mexican Era Documents are contained within Hanging Files. Each Hanging File is Referred as a File and Number Sequentially. The Hanging Files are in Five (5) Clear Plastic Containers with Blue Plastic Tops and Labeled as follows:

File 5-SJB Bapt., 23 March 1795-21 July 1799 "2nd Book" (Transferred to Family Sheets) #312-#508. One burial #436-9 November 1797. SJB Bapt.-4 August 1799-2 January 1804, 2nd Book. #611-#670, transferred to family sheets.

File 6-SJB Baptisms, 1 July 1786-15 March 1795 #1-311. (2nd Book of Baptisms) Transferred to family sheets. S.J. Bta. Baptisms, BKI, not in chronological order numerically.

File 7-SJB: Tropas Burials. Burials SJB 1403-1895.

File 8-San Juan Bautista Burials 1786-1814, “Burials of the Royal Presidio of San Juan Bautista Del Rio Grande, 1786-1832.” SJB#2, Burials (25 Jan 1778)-4 Sept 1780. And a single entry of 27 March 186 burial (out of turn). Transferred to Family sheets.

File 3-Baptism 27 Dnero 1786-14 Sept 1828, SJB. Entierros, 14 August 1801-7 July 1828 (Tropas).

File 4- S.J. Bta, baptisms #772 (Dec 1807 to # 1154 1 July 1813), BKI. S.J.Bta Baptisms, Baptisms BKI, numerical sequence not in chronological order, #625 (19 February 1804- 27 December 1807) #772.

File 5-S.J.Bta. 1786-1807 and 1776-1828 Ellie, between 25 July 1789, entries #53 thru 58 were missing from the originals.

File 6-S.J.B. Marriages 30Nov 1807-15 September 1828 starts with 22 Aug 1817. S.J.B. Marriages 13 August 1776-25 July 1789, (#1 to #52), all transferred. Civilian Marriages.

File 1-Provincia de Coahuila-Missions, Ranches, & Villa, 1823.

File 2-Burials, San Juan Bautista, (Guerrero, Coahuila 1851-04.25.1870.

File 3-Gigedo Burials 1829-1830. "A Spanish Language divorce decree filed 1884. "Enterros de Guerrero de 1807 @ 1819."

File 4- "Enterros de Dulce Nombre de Jesus, 24 July 1832 to 29 April 1857," and "Entierros de Gigedo 24 Julio – 9 de Abil de 1854."

File 5- "Entierros de Nava 23 Sep 1899 to 6 Jan 1898."
